ACCELERATOR TRACKS

NextCycle Michigan accelerator tracks help selected teams develop investment-attractive and implementation-ready projects that increase recycling access and services to build a resilient and circular economy in Michigan. Tracks focus on various types of projects including:



Food, Liquids, & Organic Waste Systems (FLOWS): Collection, processing or end market use of organic materials, primarily food scrap and food waste.



Recycling Innovation & Technology (**RIT**): Novel material recovery or sorting technologies, recycled content products, new uses for recycled or organic materials or other innovations in sustainable materials management.



Intergovernmental Initiatives & Public-Private Partnerships (I2P3): Public entityled initiatives that advance recycling and composting in communities.



Recycling Supply Chain (RSC): Development of recycling supply chain infrastructure through hub and spoke systems, logistics, processing or material end market innovations.

Out-of-state organizations can apply; however, the project must be implemented in Michigan or directly recover Michigan materials.
